

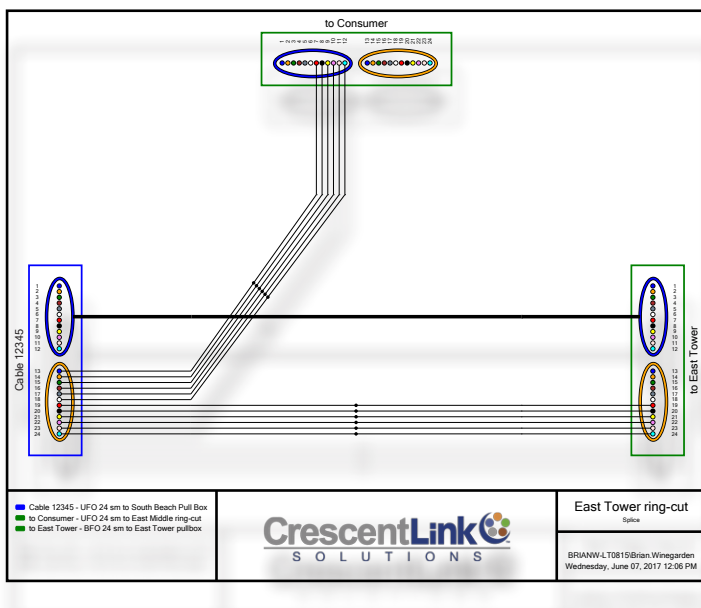

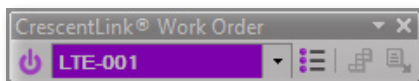

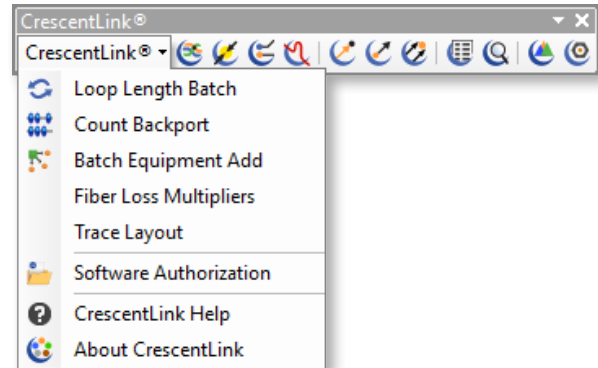











Work Order Manager Toolbar



This unique set of tools provides users with lists of plant features. It allows for tracking and updating of a work order during every stage of the design and installation process.

Network Manager Toolbar



- 
Manager Tool:
Add/remove/edit equipment and counts, trace cables, walk a curcuit, access reports, and attach images.
- 
Connector Tool:
Connects: cable-cable, cable-equipment, or equipment-equipment. Shows splice configuration.
- 
Splice Diagram Tool:
Create a PDF for any splice point in the map.
- 
Distance Trace Tool:
Trace fiber to show the location in the map from OTDR trace results. Includes cable helix factor in the results.
- 
Reporter Tool:
Single Use Fiber Report, Cable Report or Cable Summary.
- 
Ripple Count Tool:
Assign and replace old counts based on work orders.
- 
Post Throw Tool:
Finalize work order counts or Remove/Undo counts in progress.
- 
Fiber Count Assignment:
Create counts on fiber cables based on CrescentLink connections.
- 
Search Tool:
Search for customers by name, address, phone number, or location I.D.



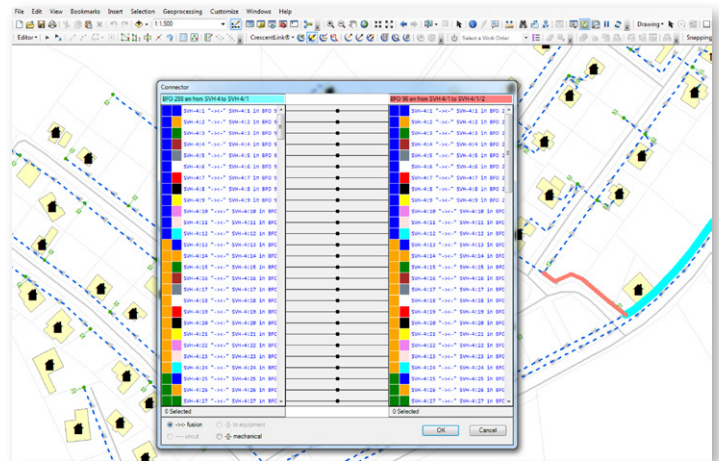

- Store images at each splice point location.
- Track any individual strand in any cable.
- Produce splice diagrams automatically.
- Create cable usage reports.
- Manage circuits to the port level.
- Track owners, users, and leases.
- Manage counts down to the fiber strand.
- Calculate theoretical dB loss for use in design.
- Manage ISP and OSP equipment-to-equipment connectivity.
- Track any stage of fiber installation from proposed to as-built.
- Perform OTDR trace functions from any splice location with equipment.
- Manage HFC networks, including SCTE symbology and data blocks (tombstones).
- Create and save custom equipment templates, including the modeled ports.
- Document uncommon or custom cables (mixed modes, non-standard colors, etc)
